



A Great Way to Earn Extra Money

The U.S. Census Bureau is recruiting for temporary part-time census jobs for the 2010 Census. The pay is good, the **hours are flexible**, and the work is close to home. Census jobs are excellent for retirees, college students, persons who want to work part-time, persons who are between jobs, or just about anyone who wants to earn extra money while performing an important service for their community. (18 years or older)

Thousands are needed for temporary jobs: Thousands of census takers are needed to conduct interviews with community residents (8 – 16 weeks of work in spring of 2010). Most positions require a valid driver's license and vehicle. Veterans bring a copy of DD-214 for point preference.

Earn good pay (\$15 + an hour) (10 – 40 hours a week) Census takers receive competitive pay on a weekly basis. In addition, you will be reimbursed for authorized mileage and related expenses.

Applicants must take a **half hour basic skills test**. Practice test can be found at www.2010censusjobs.gov

Bilingual speakers are encouraged to apply! Bilingual skills in English and other languages are needed.
